17 Flemister: Huh?

18 Dawkins: Who is it?

19 Flemister: Do what?

20 Dawkins: Do you know who it is?

21 Flemister: Yeah, I got caller ID now.

22 Dawkins: Okay - I's about to say they might really need to talk to you or something.

3 Flemister: No, it ain't important.

24 Dawkins: Well, I figured I needed to call ya, I felt bad about the other night and I needed just
25 to explain.

26 Flemister: No, you ain't - you ain't gotta explain nothing.

27 Dawkins: No, I just wanted to say that it wasn't you -- I wanted to say that you didn't say
28 anything wrong at all - or do anything wrong -- you need to answer that 'cause they're gonna
29 keep on calling.

30 Flemister: Hold on, alright.

31 Dawkins: Okay.

32 Flemister: Now.

33 Dawkins: Hey, you there?

34 Flemister: Um-hum.

35 Dawkins: Okay.

36 Flemister: Alright, my bad.

37 Dawkins: But anyway, I just needed to say that it wasn't anything you said - 'cause I know
38 you were really worried about making my mad or hurt my feelings about what you said - about
39 the whole thing you know --

40 Flemister: Yeah.

41 Dawkins: and honestly I need to talk about it - it was just like I just - it wasn't you at all --

42 Flemister: Yeah.

43 Dawkins: just -- and it was nothing you said and honestly like I said, I need to talk about it
44 and I need to get a (inaudible) and es-- and especially like I know you understand because I've

45 known you for a long time you know --

46 Flemister: Um-hum.

47 Dawkins: and I just - I wanted to apologize if you took that personal.

48 Flemister: I didn't know what to think.

49 Dawkins: Yeah, and I was like - you know when I don't know what to say I just leave
50 people hanging and I do that sometimes and I's like well I'll call him back and talk to him - I'm
51 sorry, I didn't get you worked up did I?

52 Flemister: No, I mean, uh, I tried to page (inaudible) today to see if you were alright --

53 Dawkins: Um-hum.

54 Flemister: tried to figure out why you hung up 'cause I --

55 Dawkins: Oh.

56 Flemister: don't - I don't know everything that's going on - I mean it ain't none of my
57 business.

58 Dawkins: Yeah.

59 Flemister: If you wanna talk to me, I'll talk with you - I'll listen.

60 Dawkins: Will you really talk with me?

61 Flemister: Um-hum.

62 Dawkins: Can I just be straight up honest with you?

63 Flemister: Yeah.

64 Dawkins: Like, I know - like you told me that you would really like to go off with me
65 sometime, right.

66 Flemister: Yeah.

67 Dawkins: And you know that we used to be really, really close --

68 Flemister: Um-hum.

69 Dawkins: you know a while ago - and good friends and everything and um, it's been a while

70 since I've spoken to you or talking to you and just seeing what was up and then all of a sudden

71 for you to pop up one night and be like - hey I care about you and I've cared about you for a long

72 time really took me off guard you know --

73 Flemister: Yeah, well I can't really believe that came - I mean, it wasn't really suppose to

74 (inaudible) got - put a lot a shit in my head.

75 Dawkins: What do you mean?

76 Flemister: Just - just talking to her - it - it was weird.

77 Dawkins: Uh, you mean you didn't mean that stuff?

78 Flemister: Yeah I meant it.

79 Dawkins: Okay.

80 Flemister: And nobody knows - nobody knew.

81 Dawkins: Well, I'm glad you called - like I really am glad you called -- but um, yeah, I don't

82 know it was just like - it took me off guard - it's not that - it's not that I was like uh, you know

83 but you just took me off guard.

84 Flemister: Did I.

85 Dawkins: And I didn't know what to think or what to say - and I was just kinda shell

86 shocked or stunned like oh my word you know what do you say - and um, but I had some time to

87 think about it today and um, I just need to be honest with you about some things.

88 Flemister: Alright.

39 Dawkins: And I don't know how - I don't know how you're gonna take 'em - but, you knew
90 a long time ago, I told you that you had every bit of potential in becoming anybody you wanted
91 to, right.

92 Flemister: Yeah.

93 Dawkins: And I'm so proud to hear that you're doing so well, like really. And it flatters me
94 so much that you were like saying you made a difference in my life but that really - that blew me
95 away to think oh my - you know oh my gah I made a difference in somebody's lif-- life and
96 nobody's told me that before and I didn't know how to take it and um, and I don't know like -- I
97 got to thinking about it and I was like, Josh really is a - a good guy and I would - I would go off

105 nothing against you it's --

106 Flemister: Yeah, I know, it's understandable.

107 Dawkins: Yeah, and I just need you to know that but it's nothing against you - and if I ask a
108 lot a questions just bear with me because I'm such - you'll - you'll find out now - I - I just ask so
109 many questions but it's just because, if I don't ask questions I don't get answers and I feel really -
110 it's like - I feel so helpless - you have to know what it's like to feel helpless - I - you know, I

1 don't know anything and I really love my brother and I miss him and there is not a day that's goes ...
112 by when I don't think about him --

113 Flemister: Yeah.

114 Dawkins: and it breaks my heart and you have to know what it's like not to - I mean have

117 Flemister: Yeah -- like I mean you know it's a little different though.

118 Dawkins: It's - it's the worse feeling in the world isn't it.

119 Flemister: Yeah.

120 Dawkins: One of. Well can - can I - like last night I just kinda listen to you talk and I
121 asked a few questions, can I ask a bunch a que-- like I - I've thought about it all day and -- and I
122 wasn't mad at you at all - I need you to know that but um, I don't know- like I have some things I
123 - I wanna ask you and get off my mind 'cause I've always been straight up and honest with you --

124 Flemister: Yeah.

125 Dawkins: about what I really of everything -- but I know you and Joey like aren't like -- like
126 tight - tight -- but didn't you say that he talked to you all the time.

127 Flemister: Yeah, but - but what he talks to me about is (inaudible)

128 Dawkins: Oh.

129 Flemister: meaning - problems with his parents and his family.

130 Dawkins: Well what happened with -- this blew my mind - what happened with you saying
131 that you were with him that night.

132 Flemister: Yeah, I's with him down in Cedartown.

3 Dawkins: But you said you were also with him when ya'll came up like on the cops and
134 everything and he got scared and called Tandy.

135 Flemister: Because he saw Isaac's truck and he wanted Tandy to call you before you heard it
136 from --

137 Dawkins: Oh, so you were with him when he called Tandy and everything?

138 Flemister: Yeah.

139 Dawkins: Oh - did you go up with him to see Asland?

140 Flemister: Huh?

141 Dawkins: Did you go up with him to Cedartown to see Asland?

142 Flemister: Yeah.

143 Dawkins: You went over Asland's house and everything?

144 Flemister: Yeah I been over there quiet a bit.

145 Dawkins: Oh, was he just - were ya'll just over there visiting with her family?

146 Flemister: Yeah, we hung out - I mean and Joey I guess - it was about the time Joey was
147 getting in good with her family and everything and he was always over there and we were just
148 down -- he was down there seeing here we were just sitting outside.

149 Dawkins: Well I hear good things about Asland's family - I hear they're really sweet people.

150 Flemister: Um.

151 Dawkins: Did you meet 'em?

152 Flemister: Yeah.

153 Dawkins: Oh, what are her parents like, are they really sweet too?

154 Flemister: They were -- ~~wasn't that long~~ with 'em.

5 Dawkins: Oh. Really.

156 Flemister: And then Chris-- I think it was Christmas Day they cooked and invited me and
157 Joey down to eat with -- we ate with her parents and then we went to her family's and at with
158 them and - I mean her family's pretty cool.

159 Dawkins: Oh.

160 Flemister: Her dad I think has a drinking problem.

161 Dawkins: Really.

162 Flemister: That's what I was told.

163 Dawkins: By -- by who?

164 Flemister: Asland.

165 Dawkins: Oh, poor thing. Well, did you - did you meet her mom before then or did you --
166 did ya'll meet her that day ya'll went down there, were they there?

167 Flemister: No I met 'em - first time I ever met 'em was Christmas Eve.

168 Dawkins: Oh.

169 Flemister: When they asked us to come to dinner on Christmas Day.

170 Dawkins: So you went with him to Cedartown and back from Cedartown?

171 Flemister: Yeah.

172 Dawkins: Huh.

173 Flemister: I spent the day with him.

174 Dawkins: I didn't know that.

175 Flemister: Think we had been to Atlanta that night -- 'cause we'd been doing something
176 together all day.

7 Dawkins: Ya'll had went to Atlanta that night and then ya'll came and visited Asland that
178 day?

179 Flemister: I don't - I don't know exactly what we did that night 'cause that's around the time
180 I moved back from Atlanta.

181 Dawkins: Oh.

182 Flemister: And I had some rough times in Atlanta and I really don't remember much.

183 Dawkins: What were you coming back from Rome - like were ya'll hanging out with people
184 in Rome - and you never called me, I'm so mad at you.

185 Flemister: What do you mean?

186 Dawkins: You were -- okay, if you were in Cedartown you were close to Rome and you
187 never called me. I'm just picking at you.

188 Flemister: I didn't call -- when I moved away I didn't - I didn't call nobody in Rome - I didn't *Remember*
189 even call my dad, I didn't call my mom.

190 Dawkins: Oh, so when all that happened you weren't living in Rome?

191 Flemister: Um-um, I just-- we were moving back to Rome - we were in the process of
192 moving back.

193 Dawkins: Oh, is that why you never called you butt.

194 Flemister: No I never, I didn't keep in touch with nobody.

195 Dawkins: You butt.

196 Flemister: Mean people come down there and went to the bar with us and everything but --

197 Dawkins: What did you think when - did Joey say, oh my gah that's Isaac's truck?

198 Flemister: I didn't --

9 Dawkins: Like what did you think - did you know that - did he say that's Sam - Sam's
200 brother's?
201 Flemister: No I knew Isaac before then I knew his truck -- Joey's truck --
202 Dawkins: How'd you know his truck before?
203 Flemister: 'cause the night that uh, Isaac and Joey got into it up at his house.
204 Dawkins: Oh, that night Joey hit him.
205 Flemister: And Joey backed --
206 Dawkins: Yeah I heard about that.
207 Flemister: Asland's car into the gas tank.
208 Dawkins: Really, he backed Asland's car into a gas tank?
209 Flemister: Um-hum.
0 Dawkins: Was her car okay?
211 Flemister: Oh no not Asland's uh, uh, Erica.
212 Dawkins: Erica, oh okay.
213 Flemister: Think that was her name wasn't it? What's that girls' name that lives on Chulio
214 Road?
215 Dawkins: Oh I don't know, I don't know anybody who lives on Chulio really.
216 Flemister: I think it was Erica - had a little Honda.
217 Dawkins: Probably -- probably, I don't really - I know who Erica is, I don't know what she
218 drives though. They drove -- I--Isaac was driving up there that night?
219 Flemister: Uh, he had a buddy driving for him 'cause he was drinking I think.
220 Dawkins: Oh, yeah I heard about the little scuffle -- well what do you think when you heard

Erica Evans - girl

1 that it was my brother - like when you passed by and Joey was like, that's my bro-- that's her
222 brother.

223 Flemister: I didn't know what to think, I's like oh my God --

224 Dawkins: And you did --

225 Flemister: I mean I didn't know what had happened.

226 Dawkins: and you didn't wanna call me and be like Sam some'em wrong with your brother?

227 Flemister: I didn't - I didn't know - I mean I didn't know -- mean I didn't know what had
228 happened - I mean I didn't --

229 Dawkins: You should of called me - if you ever think something's wrong with any of my
230 friends - I'm - I'm worried, 'cause you know me close enough to be like, Sam what's up,
231 something's wrong -- just check it out.

32 Flemister: Yeah.

233 Dawkins: I would with you.

234 Flemister: Well things were weird back then though.

235 Dawkins: They were weird.

236 Flemister: I mean I had - I had some problems.

237 Dawkins: Oh.

238 Flemister: I's a little strung out -- I had little trouble - drinking problems you know.

239 Dawkins: Well at least you're mature enough to admit it - accept it and move on from it you
240 know.

241 Flemister: Yeah, I mean it ain't completely over with but it ain't an everyday thing -- and it
242 ain't an every weekend thing.

13. Dawkins: Had ya'll been drinking that night ya'll were coming back from Asland?

244 Flemister: Think I was.

245 Dawkins: You were?

246 Flemister: I mean I - I's drinking every day back then.

247 Dawkins: Who was driving?

248 Flemister: Joey.

249 Dawkins: Oh.

250 Flemister: His white truck.

251 Dawkins: Oh.

252 Flemister: Little white piece of crap he had.

253 Dawkins: Was that from the ole Watkins Auto Center's lot too?

254 Flemister: Um-hum, yep. I don't know how they sell them cars, really don't. I mean they

255 drive 'em - every one of 'em on the lot 'fore they sell 'em -- Joey and Tandy get to drive 'em.

256 Dawkins: I know. That's funny that you said that.

257 Flemister: I mean I don't - we were talking about it - me and my dad were talking about it the

258 other day, I mean they drive every car and the quality of the cars really ain't all that good.

259 Dawkins: Oh, I'm sure most people would agree.

260 Flemister: I didn't say it.

261 Dawkins: Oh, well I did and I'm not scared to.

262 Flemister: Oh, I ain't scared of the boy -- I'll be the first one jump up in his face, tell him he

263 ain't nothing to me.

264 Dawkins: So, where did ya'll go when ya'll got back to Rome? Like after ya'll had --

5 Flemister: I came home.

266 Dawkins: He to-- he took you home?

267 Flemister: Yeah, and then Joey went home.

268 Dawkins: He went home at - right after that?

269 Flemister: I guess I mean I don't know where he went after he dropped you off.

270 Dawkins: He dropped you off.

271 Flemister: Trying think who I called when I got home.

272 Dawkins: Well what in the world -- I don't know when Joey's name was brought up in all

273 that crap - I have no clue, did he say anything to you about it?

274 Flemister: Um-um, he never -- me and him never talked about that much.

275 Dawkins: He never said a word about being mad or pissed off at anybody?

6 Flemister: Um-um --mean he couldn't talk with me about it because he was under

277 investigation.

278 Dawkins: Well he's not any more.

279 Flemister: No, no - no we don't talk about it now any way.

280 Dawkins: Well why you think that it - have ya'll even brought it like - how does he feel when

281 he sees those big billboards up about Isaac and flyers every where?

282 Flemister: He don't say nothing to me.

283 Dawkins: You don't notice anything strange - in his voice or anything?

284 Flemister: Umm, I mean I don't - not really because I've hung out with Paul here and there--

285 Dawkins: Yeah.

286 Flemister: And Paul's the same way Joey is - mean you know how Paul was under

7 investigation too --

288 Dawkins: Yeah.

289 Flemister: and every since that neither one of 'em have really talked to me about anything --

290 that had to do with that.

291 Dawkins: Did-- didn't you say some kind of rumor that you heard -- is it a rumor or who did

292 you hear that from that Paul's car was backed in the bushes - like be honest - it - I'm not gonna

293 say anything.

294 Flemister: It wasn't Paul's car it was Chad's truck.

295 Dawkins: But last night you told me it was Paul's car - you said, Paul's black Camaro last

296 night.

297 Flemister: Yeah, but I didn't wanna say nothing about Chad.

298 Dawkins: In front of --

299 Flemister: Yeah.

300 Dawkins: Breanne.

301 Flemister: Yeah.

302 Dawkins: Oh.

303 Flemister: I mean I just- I heard that his truck was spotted. I mean I don't - I don't - I don't

304 know everything, I don't know anything about what happened.

305 Dawkins: Who did you hear that from?

306 Flemister: Uh, --

307 Dawkins: It's not bothering me you know I'm leaving --

308 Flemister: I mean this is - this was all while back --

310 Dawkins: yeah, I mean I'm leaving soon - I know really - I don't care any more I just - I just
311 wanna be - ask my little questions so I can settle what I have to settle in my heart and say, you
312 know what Sam --
313 Flemister: (inaudible) you need some answers --
314 Dawkins: it's never -- it'll never be over --
315 Flemister: yeah you need some answers.
316 Dawkins: yeah I've gotta settle something in my heart to move on with the rest of my school
317 and the rest of my life because he - if - if it was turned around my brother loves me so much, he
318 would be fighting for answers and you know what I don't do anything every day I just let it pass -
319 - and it kills me and I never talk to anybody about it and I never ask any questions, you're the first
320 person that I've really just opened up and said, hey let me ask some questions and thank you so
321 much for letting me do it --
322 Flemister: Uh, --
323 Dawkins: because nobody understand.
324 Flemister: if I know -- if I knew anything about it I mean I'd tell you - I mean believe me -
325 'cause I know you deserve some answers.
326 Dawkins: Well why in the world - when Joey was being investigated, how come you didn't
327 say, hey yeah I was with him - to clear his name?
328 Flemister: I wasn't getting brought into it.
329 Dawkins: Why, were you scared because of like your previous crap, that you were gonna get
330 like dogged for it?
331 Flemister: No, I - I've had my trouble with the law - my name -- you know my name ain't too

1 clear 'bout --

332 Dawkins: yeah.

333 Flemister: anything I say -- it - you know, it wouldn't be believed.

334 Dawkins: You think?

335 Flemister: Not with me and Joey together - as much trouble as we've been in.

336 Dawkins: I um.

337 Flemister: Together -- been a few warrants taken out for us and we really weren't suppose to

338 be around each other.

339 Dawkins: Ya'll had warrants taken out for - against each other?

340 Flemister: No, people took 'em out on me and him - for paint balling their houses and stuff.

341 Dawkins: And ya'll were around the houses?

2 Flemister: Huh?

343 Dawkins: And ya'll were around the houses?

344 Flemister: No, we were riding down the road --

345 Dawkins: Oh, that's bad --

346 Flemister: and we had a car wreck -- that's the night we wrecked his truck.

347 Dawkins: Oh.

348 Flemister: The red one.

349 Dawkins: Yeah, I don't know his cars, I don't know.

350 Flemister: (inaudible)

351 Dawkins: I don't really keep up with him that much.

352 Flemister: Uh-huh. He called today and I just told Christy I was in the bed.

3 Dawkins: Do you try to avoid him a lot now?

354 Flemister: Yeah I really- mean I don't hang out with him that much.

355 Dawkins: Well how did ya'll go from being -- why did ya'll go from being so close during all
356 that time and then hanging out and everything to --

357 Flemister: Every once and a while.

358 Dawkins: yeah, dropping like a - is it because -- honestly if I were in your shoes I wouldn't
359 hang out with an accused murderer either.

360 Flemister: Um-um.

361 Dawkins: You know I mean, nothing else but I wouldn't -- but then again, I don't
362 understand because I'll go ahead and tell you - if that was my good friend - if that was Breanne
363 being brought up for anything and I was with her and I knew she didn't do something, I'd be like
364 Breanne, I love you girl and I'm gonna stand up for you and I will be at your side and defend you
365 and tell 'em I was with you and I know you didn't do it.

366 Flemister: Yeah but mine and Joey's relationship is different.

367 Dawkins: You let him go by his self, that's rough -- like really, I mean you know --

368 Flemister: I mean it ain't I let him go down my him self , it's -- it's more of it ain't none of
369 my business. I mean if it was me Joey wouldn't done nothin' for me -- 'cause that's the type a
370 person Joey is.

371 Dawkins: Well Joey's classified between - how can I put this - Joey has personified himself
372 to be irrational, irresponsible, full of rage --

373 Flemister: Crazy.

374 Dawkins: crazy, you said it yourself --

5 Flemister: Yeah.

376 Dawkins: and somewhat -- well, not somewhat -- highly deceptive -- do you agree?

377 Flemister: Yeah.

378 Dawkins: To all of this?

379 Flemister: Yeah.

380 Dawkins: He's proven himself to be all of those to every person he's ever come in contact

381 with -- his family can not deny it --

382 Flemister: Uh, Joey has problems with everybody -- everybody's got a problem with Joey.

383 Dawkins: Well I mean --

384 Flemister: No I mean they really do.

385 Dawkins: I know - I --

386 Flemister: 'cause every time I'm with Joey I've gotta watch my back - I don't trust Joey -- I

387 don't trust Joey to stand any where I can't see him.

388 Dawkins: Well you know Joey has a history of shooting at people.

389 Flemister: Yeah.

390 Dawkins: Have you ever seen him - see -- seen him shot at somebody?

391 Flemister: Not in -- not with anything other than a paint ball gun.

392 Dawkins: You've seen him shoot at somebody with a paint ball gun though.

393 Flemister: I mean we shot at people's houses.

394 Dawkins: Well he's aimed guns at people's heads before.

395 Flemister: See I don't -- I've heard -- Breanne told me that last night.

396 Dawkins: Yep, sure was --

97 Flemister: That's - that's the first I've ever heard about it.

398 Dawkins: Yep.

399 Flemister: But as far as Joey goes, I have -- I don't trust him and if it ever came down to it I
400 wouldn't - I wouldn't be there for him -- and he's not that good of a friend to me.

401 Dawkins: Well, I have to ask you a question Josh, and be honest with me - it really won't
402 hurt my feelings, I just need to be honest with me -- I know he talks to you some and if he ever
403 told you anything of importance, would you call me and let me know.

404 Flemister: Yeah.

405 Dawkins: Would you be willing to tell somebody, I know he said this and I know he said
406 that?

407 Flemister: Yeah.

08 Dawkins: Well you would - like if he ever said, I'm telling - if he ever confessed up or
409 anything like that you would call me.

410 Flemister: Oh in a heartbeat.

411 Dawkins: Okay.

412 Flemister: If - if he did it then he deserves to pay for it - 'cause that's wrong.

413 Dawkins: Like, by no means, I don't think, I watched that Green Mile movie and I go ahead
414 and tell you, whoever did it I wanted 'em to fry and I thought about it and by no means you
415 know, my daddy raised me that two wrongs don't make a right.

416 Flemister: Yeah.

417 Dawkins: But by God I just want somebody to look me in the eyes and say, I did it - and you
418 know what, if somebody has the balls enough to say, I did it, then you know what - I'm gonna be

9 ... able to start - not be able to - but I'm gonna be able to start to forgive that person in some sense
420 where I can move on with my life and not be full of hate because I'm not a hateful person and this
421 whole dang thing has ripped my life apart.

422 Flemister: Yeah.

423 Dawkins: And you know if -- I don't know -- if he did do it I just want him to look me in the
424 eyes and say, you know what, I did it -- hello, that's your line --

425 Flemister: Alright, hold on one second.

426 Dawkins: Okay.

427 Flemister: Don't hand up.

428 Dawkins: I won't.

429 Flemister: Gah, hey.

30 Dawkins: Hey.

431 Flemister: Alright.

432 Dawkins: Why you saying, gah, for?

433 Flemister: Damn girl's fucking crazy.

434 Dawkins: Who?

435 Flemister: Jill.

436 Dawkins: Oh, no doubt, no doubt.

437 Flemister: You know her?

438 Dawkins: Yeah.

439 Flemister: Wah, I can't stand her.

440 Dawkins: Well, I just don't know what to think - I really don't -- why didn't Joey - when

1 everybody was on his back, say - well somebody else was with me, Josh was with me - ~~why didn't~~
442 he say that?

443 Flemister: Ah, he told me he did tell somebody that.

444 Dawkins: Because Joey -- Joey isn't afraid to ride out anybody - if he thinks he's not gonna
445 go down by himself.

446 Flemister: Well he did tell somebody that and I denied it - I's - who, I wouldn't with you.

447 Dawkins: Who'd he tell?

448 Flemister: I don't know, this is when everybody was calling -- when you know, all that shit
449 was going on.

450 Dawkins: Why'd you deny it?

451 Flemister: I um, I didn't want to be brought in it.

52 Dawkins: Yeah.

453 Flemister: And I'm not gone sit there and stand by Joey's side when he's - no.

454 Dawkins: Yeah. Well, you know if you ever did hear something and you ever did know
455 something, I'm sure there's protections and things they could do, you know that don't you.

456 Flemister: Oh I mean, if I - if Joey ever told me anything - if I ever found out anything, I
457 wouldn't be worried about protection - I'd - I'd go straight to the police. And I mean I
458 wouldn't have no second thoughts about it, I mean people can call em a narc or rat or whatever
459 but for what was done I don't care what anybody says, it - they deserve you know - ya'll deserve
460 justice.

461 Dawkins: Well straight up, can I be honest, I still think Joey did it.

462 Flemister: I mean that's uh, well -- I'm not gone sit here and defend him, I mean it ain't - that

3 ain't -- it ain't me.

464 Dawkins: Did Joey Watkins shoot my brother?

465 Flemister: I mean I don't know. He never said nothing to me.

466 Dawkins: Well you know, I don't know either - but I guarantee you one thing, God says,
467 Surely, surely, all your sins will find you out.

468 Flemister: Yeah.

469 Dawkins: And you what - might as well sooner than later - it's gonna happen.

470 Flemister: Yeah.

471 Dawkins: And that's the way it is.

472 Flemister: If he did do it I'd like to know -- I'd like to know who I'm hanging around with.

473 Dawkins: Well, I wanted you -- I just - I had to talk to you some more about it and show
74 you that I really could talk about it and that I did need talk about it and that I could be mature
475 about the whole thing. But um, I've got a junk I have to get ready for school - can you believe
476 it's the-- I have to leave in a couple a days and I don't even have my stuff on hangers or washed
477 or anything.

478 Flemister: (inaudible)

479 Dawkins: I really - I've been so worried about like buying stuff for my room I don't even
480 have my clothes packed up.

481 Flemister: But if you need some help moving everything, call me.

482 Dawkins: Okay.

483 Flemister: I'll give you a hand.

484 Dawkins: Well listen sweetie I'm on let you go to bed, I just really had to call you about that

5 and I'll probably talk to you some more later on.

486 Flemister: Alright well, if you need to talk some more tonight give me a call I ain't going to
487 bed no time soon, I'll be up.

488 Dawkins: I'll be up for a little bit more and I'm probably gonna go to sleep, but um, you
489 know that my number is always open - I don't care if you hear a rumor, you call me, okay.

490 Flemister: I will.

491 Dawkins: But just because I don't anything, I'm bout to be gone - it's really, it's just like
492 finding a needle in a haystack.

493 Flemister: Yeah.

494 Dawkins: But thank you so much and I'm sure I'll talk to you later.

495 Flemister: Alright.

496 Dawkins: Okay.

497 Flemister: Bye.
